FINISHED MEASUREMENTS Bust (closed): (40, 44, 48) [52, 56, 60] {64, 68, 72}" / (101.5, 112, 122) [132, 142, 152.5] {162.5, 172.5, 183} cm (Fronts do not meet) Length: (25, 25½, 26) [26, 26½, 26½] {27, 28, 28½}" / (63.5, 65, 66) [66, 67.5, 67.5] {68.5, 71, 72.5} cm Shown in size 44" / 112 cm. Recommended ease: 4-6" / 5-10 cm positive ease.

#### YARN

BERROCO MERCADO (100 grs): (8, 9, 10) [11, 12, 13] {14, 15, 16} hanks #4106 Niebla

**NEEDLES and NOTIONS** Knitting needles, size 8 / 5 mm or size to obtain gauge 3 stitch markers

#### GAUGE

16 sts and 20 rows = 4'' / 10 cm in St st and Lace Pattern To save time and ensure accurate measurements, take time to check gauge.

#### LACE PATTERN

Multiple of 11 sts

Rows 1, 3 and 5 (RS): \* [K2 tog] twice, yo, [k1, yo] 3 times, [SSK] twice; rep from \* across.

Rows 2 and 4: Purl.

Row 6: Knit.

Rows 7 and 9: Knit. Rows 8 and 10: Purl.

Rep these 10 rows for Lace Pattern.

#### NOTE

When working Row 6 of Lace Pattern on WS (this forms a Garter ridge on RS of work), knit across all sts on needle, even those being worked in St st at each edge. This carries the ridge across all sts to the edge and better keeps the continuity of the pattern.

## **BACK**

Cast on (81, 88, 96) [105, 112, 121] {129, 136, 145} sts. Knit 6 rows.

Establish Lace Pattern: Row 1 (RS): Knit (2, 0, 4) [3, 1, 0] {4, 2, 1}, pm, work Row 1 of Lace Pattern over (77, 88, 88) [99, 110, 121] {121, 132, 143} sts, pm, (2, 0, 4) [3, 1, 0] {4, 2, 1}. Keeping (2, 0, 4) [3, 1, 0] {4, 2, 1} st(s) each side in St st and remaining sts in Lace Pattern, work even until piece measures 17½" / 44 cm from beginning, end on WS. Mark beginning and end of last row for beginning of armholes.

Work even until armholes measure (7½, 8, 8½) [8½, 9, 9] {9½, 10, 10½}" / (19, 20.5, 21.5) [21.5, 23, 23] {24, 25.5, 26.5} cm, end on WS. Bind off all sts. Mark center (31, 32, 32) [31, 32, 31] {31, 32, 31} sts for back neck with (25, 28, 32) [37, 40, 45] {49, 52, 57} sts on each side.

#### **LEFT FRONT**

Cast on (38, 42, 46) [50, 54, 58] {62, 66, 70} sts. Knit 6 rows. **Establish Lace Pattern: Row 1 (RS):** Knit (2, 0, 4) [3, 1, 0] {4, 2, 1}, pm, work Row 1 of Lace Pattern over (22, 22, 22) [33, 33, 44] {44, 44, 55} sts, pm, knit (2, 8, 8) [2, 8, 2] {2, 8, 2}, pm, k12.

**Row 2:** Knit to first marker, sm, purl (2, 8, 8) [2, 8, 2] {2, 8, 2},







sm, work Row 2 of Lace Pattern to last marker, purl to end. Work even in pattern as established until piece measures 17½" / 44 cm from beginning, end on WS.

Mark end of last row for beginning of armhole.

Work even until armhole measures (5½, 6, 6½) [6½, 7, 7] {7½, 8, 8½}" / (14, 15, 16.5) [16.5, 18, 18] {19, 20.5, 21.5} cm, end on RS.

**Shape Neck: Next Row (WS):** Bind off 12 sts of front band, remove marker, then work to end—(26, 30, 34) [38, 42, 46] {50, 54, 58} sts.

Dec 1 st at neck edge every RS row (1, 2, 2) [1, 2, 1] {3, 2, 1} time(s)—(25, 28, 32) [37, 40, 45] {47, 52, 57} sts.

Work even until armhole measures (7½, 8, 8½) [8½, 9, 9] {9½, 10, 10½}" / (14, 15, 16.5) [16.5, 18, 18] {19, 20.5, 21.5} cm, end on WS. Bind off.

## **RIGHT FRONT**

Cast on (38, 42, 46) [50, 54, 58] {62, 66, 70} sts. Knit 6 rows. **Establish Lace Pattern: Row 1 (RS):** K12, pm, knit (2, 8, 8) [2, 8, 2] {2, 8, 2}, pm, work Row 1 of Lace Pattern to last (2, 0, 4) [3, 1, 0] {4, 2, 1} st(s), pm, knit to end.

**Row 2:** Purl to first marker, sm, work Row 2 of Lace Pattern to next marker, sm, purl to last marker, sm, knit to end. Work even in pattern as established until piece measures

17½" / 44 cm from beginning, end on WS. Mark beginning of last row for beginning of armhole.

Work even until armhole measures (5½, 6, 6½) [6½, 7, 7] {7½, 8, 8½}" / (14, 15, 16.5) [16.5, 18, 18] {19, 20.5, 21.5} cm, end on WS.

Shape Neck: Next Row (RS): Bind off 12 sts of front band, remove marker, then work to end—(26, 30, 34) [38, 42, 46] {50, 54, 58} sts.

Work 1 row even.

Dec 1 st at neck edge every RS row (1, 2, 2) [1, 2, 1] {3, 2, 1} time(s)—(25, 28, 32) [37, 40, 45] {47, 52, 57} sts. Work even until armhole measures (7½, 8, 8½) [8½, 9, 9] {9½, 10, 10½}" / (14, 15, 16.5) [16.5, 18, 18] {19, 20.5, 21.5} cm, end on WS. Bind off.

#### **SLEEVES**

Cast on (37, 37, 37) [41, 41, 41] {46, 46, 46} sts. Knit 6 rows.. **Establish Lace Pat: Row 1 (RS):** Knit (2, 2, 2) [4, 4, 4] {1, 1, 1}, pm, work Row 1 of Lace Pattern over (33, 33, 33) [33, 33, 33] {44, 44, 44} sts, pm, knit to end.

**Row 2:** Purl to first marker, sm, work Row 2 of Lace Pattern to last marker, sm, purl to end.

Work even in pattern as established until sleeve measures 1½" / 4 cm from beginning, end on WS.

Inc Row (RS): K1, M1, work to the last stitch, M1, k1—2 sts inc'd.

Rep Inc Row every (4th, 4th, 4th) [4th, 4th, 4th] {2nd, 2nd, 2nd} row (10, 12, 14) [12, 14, 14] {15, 17, 19} times more—(59, 63, 67) [67, 71, 71] {76, 80, 84} sts.


Work even until sleeve measures 14" / 35 cm from beginning, end on WS. Bind off.

#### **FINISHING**

Sew shoulders seams.

**Neckband:** With RS facing, begin at right front neck edge, pick up and knit 12 sts across right front band, 8 sts along right front neck edge, (31, 32, 32) [31, 32, 31] {31, 32, 31} sts across back neck edge, 8 sts along left front neck edge, then 12 sts across left front band—(71, 72, 72) [71, 72, 71] {71, 72, 71} sts. Knit 5 rows, end on WS. Bind off. Sew in sleeves between markers. Sew side and sleeve seams. Weave in all ends and block as desired.



#### STANDARD ABBREVIATIONS & TERMS

beg: beginning **CC**: contrasting color

CDD: Centered Double Decrease—Slip 2 together (as if to

k2tog), knit 1, pass the 2 slipped stitches over

cn: cable needle dec: decrease

dpn(s): double pointed needle(s)

end on WS: end having just completed a Wrong Side row. end on RS: end having just completed a Right Side row Garter St: Knit EVERY row when working back and forth in rows. Knit 1 round, purl 1 round when working in the round.

inc: increase k: knit

**k tbl:** knit through the back loop(s) k2tog: knit 2 stitches together **k3tog:** knit 3 stitches together

**kfb:** knit in the front and back of the next st

LH: left hand

**LLI:** Left Lifted Increase—Insert LH needle into the purl bump one row below the st just worked on the RH needle and knit into this st (1 st inc'd)

M1: Make 1—Pick up horizontal strand between stitch just worked and next stitch from front to back, place on left hand needle, knit this stitch through the back (1 stitch

M1L: Make 1 Left—Work as for M1.

M1p: Make 1 purl—Pick up horizontal strand between stitch just worked and next stitch from front to back, place on left hand needle, purl this stitch through the back (1 stitch increased).

M1pL: Make 1 purl Left—Work as for M1p.

M1pR: Make 1 purl Right—Pick up horizontal strand between stitch just worked and next stitch from back to front, place on left hand needle, purl this stitch through the front (1 stitch increased).

M1R: Make 1 Right—Pick up horizontal strand between stitch just worked and next stitch from back to front, place on left hand needle, knit this stitch through the front (1 stitch increased).

MC: main color

**p**: purl

**p tbl:** purl through the back loop(s) p2tog: purl 2 stitches together p3tog: purl 3 stitches together

pat(s): pattern(s)

pm: place marker

psso: pass slipped stitch over knit stitch

rep: repeat

Rev St st: Reverse Stockinette Stitch—Purl 1 row, knit 1 row alternately when working back and forth in rows. The purl side is the right side of the work. Purl EVERY round when working in the round.

RH: right hand

**RLI:** Right Lifted Increase—Insert RH needle into the purl bump of the next st on the LH needle and knit into this st (1 st inc'd)

rnd(s): round(s) RS: right side sl: slip

sm: slip marker

SSK: Slip 2 stitches knitwise, insert point of left hand needle through fronts of these 2 stitches and knit 2 together.

SSP: Slip 2 stitches knitwise, transfer these 2 stitches back to left hand needle, purl 2 together through the back loops.

SSSK: Slip 3 stitches knitwise, insert point of left hand needle through fronts of these 3 stitches and knit 3 together.

st(s): stitch(es)

**St st:** Stockinette Stitch—Knit 1 row, purl 1 row alternately when working back and forth in rows. The knit side is the right side of work. Knit EVERY round when working in the round.

**tbl:** through back loop(s)

w&t: wrap and turn, a method of concealing a hole created in short row shaping. On RS rows: With yarn held in front, slip next stitch purlwise, then bring yarn between needles to the back. Slip that same stitch back to the left needle. Turn your work. On WS Rows: With yarn held in back, slip next stitch purlwise, then bring yarn between needles to the front. Slip that same stitch back to the left needle. Turn your work. Unless otherwise indicated, each time you come to a wrapped stitch when working subsequent rows, slip the wrap back over stitch and onto needle, then work the wrap together with its accompanying stitch.

WS: wrong side

wyib: with yarn in back wyif: with yarn in front

yo: yarn over

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
